Easter Springs Anew

In her wisdom, the Church places the feast of Easter in the season of spring to give us nature's living images of the paschal mystery we celebrate. How our hearts soar with the first green shoots that pop through brown soil and leftover snow! And how we welcome colorful spring bulbs after a long, drab winter! With each spring we

know again that life abounds – that early darkness gives way to longer daylight, that dull landscape wakes again to greens and yellows and purples, that dead-looking trees testify again to the life that hibernates unseen in their roots.



So it is with the deep meaning of this Easter feast in which we celebrate God's triumph over death. Jesus' physical body, once so mutilated and lifeless, bursts forth from the tomb, vibrant and radiant. Suffering and diminishment are transformed into fulness of life. Death does not have the last word but gives way to life. In this story we claim our salvation by Jesus' faithfulness to his father, to his mission, to love.

And the Easter story continues on in our lives and gives meaning to our human experience. We have seen this recently in the news coverage of natural disasters in Chile and Haiti, where in the midst of terrible devastation love abounds and triumphs. We know the deep meaning of the paschal mystery in our relationships when trust and forgiveness rise out of experiences of hurt and pain. We know God's transforming power when illness and diminishment open us to trust and love rather than to hopelessness and bitterness.

In these and so many other ways, God continues to do Easter "work" among us, inviting us to know in our lives and relationships God's power to transform us, to draw us ever deeper into fulness of life, no matter what the circumstances in which we find ourselves. In this Easter season, may we give God room to work in our lives the transformation God dreams us for each of us!

Bookstore Holds Treasures

Bethany's bookstore holds many treasures for those who love to read and are thirsty for "soul food." We highlight two sections of the bookstore for your personal growth.

The bookstore stocks books in dreamwork and Jungian psychology to introduce people to inner work through dreamwork and to support and give resources for continued growth as they explore their dreams, either in dream groups that meet at Bethany, in retreat and one-on-one spiritual direction, or in other ways. **The dreamwork section** currently includes 20 titles on a variety of aspects of dreamwork by authors prominent in the field. *Dreams and Spiritual Growth* by Savary, Berne, and Williams (Paulist, 1984, \$18.95) and *Dreams as Metaphor: The Power of the Image* by Ann Sayre Wiseman (Ansayre Press, 1987, \$21) offer hands-on exercises for working with individual dreams.

Dreams and Healing by John Sanford (Paulist, 1978, \$14.95), Dream Language: Self-Understanding through Imagery and Color by Robert Hoss (Innersource, 2005, \$20), and The Wisdom of Your Dreams by Jeremy Taylor (Tarcher, 2009, \$16.95) serve as a good introduction to dreamwork and give helpful background information.

Other books focus on specific areas of interest to dreamers: *Families and the Interpretation of Dreams* by Edward Bruce Bynum (Paraview, 2003, \$19.95), *See* Bookstore, p. 2

Dreaming Beyond Death: A Guide to Pre-Death Dreams and Visions by Kelly Bulkeley and Patricia Bulkley (Beacon, 2005, \$14), and Aspects of the Feminine and Aspects of the Masculine by C. G. Jung (Princeton, 1982 and 1989, \$19).

The **enneagram section** currently contains 21 titles to assist people in their use of this ancient personality theory for their own growth and transformation and as a tool in understanding relationship dynamics.

The bookstore carries these basic primers on the theory: *Personality Types* by Riso and Hudson (Houghton Mifflin, 1996, \$15) and *The Enneagram* by Helen Palmer (Harper One, 1988, \$16.99). A simpler presentation of the system can be found in two cartoon books by Renee Baron and Elizabeth Wagele: *The Enneagram*

Made Easy (Harper One, 1994, \$\$18) and Are You My Type, Am I Yours? (Harper One, 1995, \$16.95).

Books that explore spirituality and the enneagram include Suzanne Zuercher's Enneagram Spirituality (Ave Maria, 1992, \$14.95) and Using the Enneagram in Prayer (Ave Maria, 2008, \$11.95); Sandra Maitri's The Spiritual Dimension of the Enneagram (Tarcher 2001, \$15.95); and Geoffrion and Nagel's The Labyrinth and the Enneagram: Circling into Prayer (Pilgrim, 2001, \$15).

Helen Palmer's *The Enneagram in Love and Work* (Harper Collins, 1995, \$16.95) explores intimate and business relationships through the enneagram lens. Parenting and the enneagram is explored by Janet Levine in *Know Your Parenting Personality* (Wiley, 2003, \$16.95) and Elizabeth Wagele in *The*

Enneagram of Parenting: The 9 Types of Children and How to Raise Them Successfully (Harper One, 1997, \$15.99).

These titles are but some of the many available in these two sections of Bethany's bookstore. We hope you'll come in and browse the shelves to find something to feed your soul and help you in your ongoing spiritual growth. For those at a distance, we are happy to help you select something by phone or e-mail and ship it to you – unless you would consider coming to Bethany for retreat and a personal visit to the bookstore!

Come Home: A Prayer Journey to the Center Within by Marie Schwan, CSJ Ave Maria Press, 2010, paper, 119 pages, \$12.95 Reviewed by Deb Szrom Steppe


There is something sacred about the idea of coming home. Marie Schwan uses the concept of home to describe our center where God dwells. It is where we know ourselves as true and good and beautiful where "no man or woman, no demon or angel can penetrate." This book is a wonderful guide to finding and living in that centered space.

Of course, there are many things that pull us off center. We all have tendencies to be bitter or critical or preoccupied with ourselves in an unhealthy way. More difficult things like childhood traumas also take us away from that sense of being grounded in God's presence. While the author acknowledges that some of the more difficult experiences need therapy for healing, only through prayer does she see it possible to return to that centered place of God's dwelling within.

The author is a noted spiritual director and has published many other spiritual works. That wealth of experience boldly comes through in this work. While the questions and prayer suggestions at the end of each chapter are challenging, her vision of centeredness in God is comforting and inviting.

I found that this book offered me a different prism through which to look at my life – especially those times where I struggle. The chapter on living centered in an uncentered world was especially poignant.



New Dream Group Forms by Joyce Diltz, PHJC

A new dream group is forming for the third Wednesday evening of each month from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. at Bethany Retreat House.

The Bethany dream group will give participants a way of doing dreamwork in community, with two people each evening presenting a dream for the group to work with. The person who presents benefits from the group's questions and reflections about the dream. Other participants are enriched by hearing and

working with dreams other than their own. Everyone in the group learns about dream work by doing it together. Dreams put us in touch with a world larger than our waking life. They can take us on a spiritual journey and put us directly in touch with the energies of God flowing at the depths of our being. Dreamwork increases our openness to God's trans-

forming and healing love, taking us deeper than consciousness to deal with our invitations to growth and transformation.

Bethany currently has two other monthly dream groups. Christine Juscik, a participant from Hammond, reflected, "I didn't realize until one of my dreams was discussed how insightful and helpful the information gleaned from my dream could be."

Rosemary Balczo of Dyer said of her experience in the

group, "I am not sure exactly when it happens – but sometime during the evening amid the dreams and discussions, tea and biscuits, words of Irish poet, John O'Donohue) 'an unforeseen sacred place.' I ready to listen to and share dreams. I am never quite sure what I take home – often it is the tiniest thread of an insight or image of another participant's dream that weaves its way into my mind and/or heart –

> enabling me to understand myself and my own dreams in a new way. I am unexpectedly surprised how dear this dream group has become to me."

Marcia Smith-Wood of Rennsalaer finds in the group "an atmosphere of gentle encouragement, intelligent inner exploration, joy, trust, and mutual respect among all of us. I look forward to every meeting

as we receive one another's dreams. When it is my turn to share a dream, the other members amaze me with their insights, giving me courage, hope and wonder for my own spiritual journey. Consequently, my own dream life has become more and more vivid, and I have entered a deeper awareness of conversation with my soul."
